#### 4. First-aid measures

#### 6. Accidental release measures

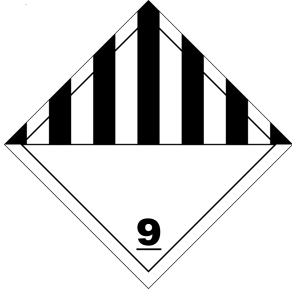

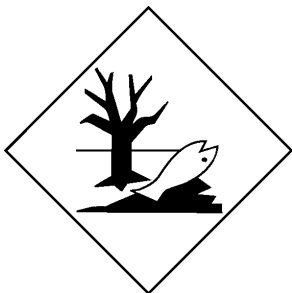
